DESE Commissioner's Guidance (as of 5/27/21)

For the fall, all districts and schools will be **required to be in-person**, **full-time**, **five days a week**, **and all DESE health and safety requirements will be lifted.** This includes all physical distancing requirements. We will collaborate with the Department of Public Health (DPH) to issue any additional health and safety recommendations over the summer. We will provide any updates to districts and schools as we receive them.

*** Masks will be required for ALL students in Massachusetts schools.



Daily Arrival Procedures

- School begins at 9:10 AM. Late bell is 9:25 AM.
- Students arriving on the bus will wait on the bus and be dismissed one bus at at a time by an adult. Bus students will enter the building through Door 3 (Rear of school)
- Students arriving by car will pull up to 4th Avenue. Please remain in your car as there is this a no parking zone.
- We will use multiple entrances to the building:
 - Pre-K & Kindergarten Early Childhood Doors (To the left of the Main Door)
 - Grades 1, 3, and 4 Main Door
 - Grade 2 4th Avenue Door

Attendance Policy & Philosophy

- Student attendance will be taken daily and entered into our database system by our school clerk.
- If students are sick, parents should still <u>CALL</u> the school at (978) 937-2871 for record keeping and doctor's notes should be emailed or faxed to the school to excuse absences
- Dismissals should be for important/emergency reasons only. Please send an email or written note to your teacher and call Mrs. Real in the Main Office.
- To minimize disruptions to the end of our school day, we ask you not dismiss your child after 3:00 PM.
- Attendance will be monitored carefully by teachers and Administrators. We will reach out when we see many absences or a pattern of absences to create an attendance plan.
- School-based attendance teams will track "daily or weekly meaningful interactions" and follow the LPS district attendance intervention plan.



Dismissal Procedures

- Pre-K & Kindergarten walkers will be dismissed through the Early Childhood doors (Door 2) to the left of the Main Door.
- Grade 1 walkers will be dismissed from the Main Door.
- Grades 2 4 walkers will be dismissed from the 4th Avenue door (Door 6).
- Bus students will meet in the gym where a teacher will help them get to the correct bus.



COVID-19 Safety Protocols & Procedures

- All student and staff members entering our building are required to wear masks indoors.
- Students are required to wear masks on buses and windows will be down at any time possible.
- We will maintain as much social distancing as possible in each classroom, however, there will be cases when students are within 3 feet of each other.
- We will be eating in the cafeteria for lunch each day. Students will only have their masks off while they are consuming food and beverage.
- We will sanitize hands throughout the day. Students entering or leaving a class or the building are required to use hand sanitizer or wash their hands.
- Classrooms will be disinfected and sanitized each day.



Enhanced COVID-19 Testing Offerings

Symptomatic Testing

- For when individuals present symptoms while at school; individuals should not go to school if experiencing symptoms while at home.
- Samples are collected at school using the BinaxNOW rapid antigen test.
- Those testing negative with isolated/mild symptoms can stay in school.

"Test and Stay" *Close contact testing*

- For when individuals are in close contact with a COVID-19 positive individual while at school.
- Samples are collected at school using the Binax NOW rapid antigen test.
- Tests are **administered daily for at least five days** from the date of exposure.

Routine COVID Safety Checks

- Routine Pooled Testing and <u>School-Based</u> Follow-Up Testing: samples are collected at school; if a pool is positive, follow-up testing at school with either BinaxNOW and/or individual PCR testing as necessary.
- Routine Pooled Testing and <u>Lab-Based</u> Follow-Up
 Testing: samples are collected; if a pool is positive, individual follow-up testing occurs at the lab, without a second sample collection.
