CURRICULUM

Lowell High School offers a comprehensive curriculum with coursework at the advanced placement, early college/dual enrollment, high honors, honors and college preparatory levels. Not all subjects are offered at all levels. Lab sciences have an (LS) designation on the school transcript. The academic year is comprised of two semesters. Each 2.5 credit course meets one period each day for one semester. Credit is issued each semester.

NOTEWORTHY EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

EARLY COLLEGE/DUAL ENROLLMENT

Early College is a partnership with Middlesex Community College that allows students to earn college credits while still in high school. Up to 35 college credits available. Dual Enrollment courses are available through University of Massachusetts Lowell including science and education electives. Courses are weighted at an AP level.

EARLY COLLEGE PROMISE

Students commit to a fifth year where they are dually enrolled at LHS and Middlesex Community College, but take courses fully on the MCC campus. Students are provided with robust supports for their studies and transition to college. All tuition and costs are covered.

LOWELL LATIN LYCEUM PROGRAM

The Lowell Latin Lyceum, established in 1999, is an academically accelerated program at Lowell High School that represents approximately 4% of the student body. The Latin Lyceum provides an intellectually stimulating environment for very highly motivated and talented students. Graduates from the Lowell Latin Lyceum are prepared for entrance to any of the nation's top colleges and universities.

PATHWAYS

LHS offers the following Pathway Programs:

- Air Force Junior ROTC Business: Marketing and Finance Civics, Citizenship, and Communities Communications Culinary Arts
- Education Engineering Environmental Sustainability Fine Arts Health & Bioscience

Students who earn 10 or more credits in a Pathway earn a Pathway concentration designation on their final transcript.
