

Dear Friends of Lowell High School Members,

In some ways "thank you" does not seem sufficient to express the gratitude I owe not only to the present members but also those that built the organization into what it is today. The Friends is truly a unique organization and your continued support of LHS students not only in their extracurricular activities but in the classroom and after they leave Lowell High is laudable.

Friends of Lowell High School's success is predicated by those who are willing to ensure its continued governance. There is one action this Board has taken that I am especially proud of, which is the vote that was taken to ensure monies withheld to cover expenses of the organization is not excessive. In the spring of 2019, after assessing our accounts, it was decided to return 80% of these monies to the groups responsible for generating it. All twenty-nine committees shared in this, totaling \$19,871. This review of funds will be an annual event, with the current Board deciding on any return of funds.

With the 2019–2020 school year coming to an end I would like to thank the Officers, Board of Directors, Parents and LHS Staff for their continued support of the organization. We are grateful for the time parents spend to assist the sports and clubs of this school to further their children's experience while at Lowell High School.

This year Moira Silva, Erin Sousa, Jen Martin, Meg Chase, Pat Coughlin, Paul Diamantopolous, Denise Hoey, Katie Larocque, Carrie Carolan, and I are leaving the board. All board members are extremely helpful in keeping the organization running, and I am deeply grateful for their contributions. Special thanks go out to Stacy Marsden for handling the Secretary duties for the last few years, Danielle Savoie for doing a fantastic job with Facebook and other communications, and most of all Moira Silva and Erin Sousa for three years of exceptional efforts handling the Treasurer's duties. I know the new board members will continue to move the FLHS forward with your continued support.

A special thanks also goes out to our Parent Reps, serving as the Chairman of the parent committee for their particular sport or activity. I know that it is not always an easy task, but we as an organization are thankful to the extra work you willingly take on; you are truly the backbone of the organization.

The efforts of you the parents in your individual committees resulted in the awarding of over 294 scholarships totaling \$68,500 including the 17 FLHS General and Named scholarships totaling \$12,750 to graduating seniors. Additionally, seven teacher grants were awarded for a total exceeding \$2,500. These grants, going to special requests from teachers, supported many students within the Lowell High School community.

The work of the various committees of Friends allow us to support such worthwhile events such as the Teacher/Staff Grants mentioned above, LHS Distinguished Alumni, LHS Athletic Hall of Fame, Teacher Appreciation Breakfast, Fall, Winter, and Spring Athletic Awards Ceremonies, Sr. Sports Awards, and a Fine Arts Department sponsorship.

I would also like to thank Marianne Busteed, Dave Lezenski, and Tom Thornton for their continued support of the Friends. I think the hidden value of Friends is their appearance at our monthly meetings, not only keeping us informed but their willingness to answer all questions asked of them. We were thankful to have an inside look at the Athletics budget, and what it takes to cover everything needed to keep our student athletes participating in organized sports.

We also had support at our meetings this year from Sgt. Joseph Kelly, representing the Lowell School Resource Officers, and two officers from the gang unit.

It has been an honor to be part of this organization for the last several years, especially the last three as president. I have had the pleasure of working with great people from the Friends of Lowell High School, Lowell High School staff, and students that represent this school and the City of Lowell.

Friends of Lowell High School General Scholarships

Last year, the Friends of LHS gave out 17 scholarships of \$750 each. Students must apply for a scholarship and meet these requirements: graduate from LHS, continue on to an accredited school/college or serve in the armed forces, participate in school activities or sports, and have a parent who is involved in the Friends of LHS.

Over the years, some of the scholarships have been endowed to memorialize special individuals. Occasionally someone creates a scholarship for a fixed length of time. These scholarships have been named after the following people:

Gerald J. Wayne (1925-1979)

Mr. Wayne was a member of LHS Class of 1943, served as a Navy pilot during WWII, and graduated from Northeastern University with a Civil Engineering Degree in 1950. He helped revitalize the LHS football booster club and played a leading role in creating the Friends of Lowell High School. He was an active and prominent member of several local organizations including the Sacred Heart Parish, Greater Lowell Association of Retarded Citizens, Holy Union Special School, Greater Lowell United Fund, and the Raytheon Company Management Club. He worked at Raytheon's South Lowell Plant for over 20 years.

John F. Abraham (1963-1980)

John was an outstanding hockey player (goalie) for Lowell High whose attitude and talent inspired his teammates. He was named to the All-Star Team for the Commonwealth Athletic Conference at the time of his accidental death. He was a member of the LHS Class of 1981.

Lawrence Wallace (1909-1982)

Mr. Wallace was a modest, quiet-spoken family man who was active in his church. He encouraged his children to serve the community to try to improve the City and its organizations.

G. Brent Leahey, Jr. (1966-1996)

Brent was a member of the LHS Class of 1984 and the LHS Basketball Teams of 1982-83 and 1983-84. The latter won the Division 1 North Basketball Championship. He graduated from Georgetown University and Georgetown Law Center and was admitted to the Massachusetts Bar while undergoing cancer treatment. He loved his family and friends, who now raise funds for Cancer research in his memory.

Senator Paul Tsongas (1941-1997)

Sen. Tsongas was a member of the LHS 1958 class. He attended Dartmouth College and Yale Law School and served in the Peace Corps. He was elected to the Lowell City Council, U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate. He was influential in many projects to spur the economic redevelopment of Lowell, including the Lowell National Historical Park, LeLacheur Park and the Tsongas Arena.

LHS Athletic Hall of Fame

This scholarship honors the relationship of FLHS and the LHS Athletic Hall of Fame in supporting athletics at Lowell High.

Slattery Family Scholarship

This 5-year scholarship was established by the Slattery Family in honor of their Lowell High graduates: Mary (1976), James (1980), Sean (1983), and Maura (1985).

Charter of Committee:

The Finance committee oversees financial matters and will make recommendations to the Board of Directors concerning financial matters affecting the Organization as may be necessary from time to time.

Dates of Meetings: 11/17/2019

Overall Committee Goals, Topics Discussed, Accomplishments and Recommendations:

The committee oversees investments, and reviews and monitors the overall financial operation of the organization in conjunction with the president, treasurer, and assistant treasurer.

The finance committee reviewed and accepted the financial statements for the fiscal year 2019. The committee reviewed the current budget, individual committee balances, and a summary of all accounts. The discussion of the budget showed that the FLHS accounts are in good shape for maintaining daily operations, without excessive discretionary funds; the current 15% holdback of fundraising monies will stay in place. The committee recommends continuing to analyze the state of the finances early in the spring, with the intention of possibly returning a portion of activity committee funds paid to the Friends of Lowell High School during the current year. Most activity committees were progressing as expected, raising funds to support their activity, and for planned scholarships.

The committee will prepare an operating budget for the Friends of Lowell High School operating account and recommend a budget to the Board of Directors for the upcoming fiscal year. The committee will furnish reports as needed.

The following account Income/Expense ledgers were reviewed: Crew, Boys Soccer, Boys Lacrosse, Field Hockey, Girls Volleyball, Girls Soccer, Theater, Boys Volleyball, Football, Girls Basketball, Skiing and Boys Basketball

Expenses/Disbursements for the previous twelve (12) months, were randomly reviewed for the above referenced accounts. The Committee confirmed back-up receipts/vendor bills for the disbursement of payment, in hard copy format.

Respective Committee requests for payment were completed satisfactorily, with required signatures and paperwork in place. The Committee found the audit to be favorable, and notably Treasurer was very organized and records were easily accessible and verified. Various parent representatives/committees were forwarded YTD Income/Expense statements and asked to confirm the transaction history and the present balance. All committees replied.

The Committee reported its findings of this Audit to the BOD at the February Meeting.

Recommendations: Treasurer could use assistance with the amount of paperwork she is required to complete. Possible subcommittee could be helpful to assist Treasurer.

Basketball Boys Committee Goals & Objectives:
