A new school year is a good time to think about your goals. Goals help you stay on track.

One way to make strong goals is by using the SMART method.

Start the Year Strong with SMART Goals continued from page 1

What does the "SMART" in SMART goals mean?

S = Specific

A specific goal has details, numbers, or dates. Examples:

- I will learn 10 new words to use when shopping.
- I will practice saying my full name and address clearly.
- I will practice ordering food in English at a restaurant.

M = Measurable

A measurable goal is something you can check or count. Examples:

- I will watch 1 English video every week.
- I will talk to a classmate in English for 5 minutes 2 times a week.
- I will write 3 text messages in English every week.

A = Achievable

An achievable goal is possible. It should be a little hard, but not too hard. Examples:

- I will learn 5 new words every week (not 50, because that's too many).
- I will write I short paragraph each week about my daily life.
- I will listen to 1 English song and learn 3 new words from it.

R = Relevant

A relevant goal is important to you. Ask yourself: Why do I want this goal? Examples:

- I want to talk to my child's teacher in English.
- I want to speak English at my job with customers.
- I want to ask questions in English at the doctor's office.

T = Time Based /Bound

Every goal needs a time limit. This helps you stay motivated. Examples:

- By March, I will learn 30 new words for shopping.
- By June, I will write I page in English about myself.
- By August, I will have I short conversation in English every week.





Whether you are learning English or working hard to pass the GED or HISET for your high school equivalency diploma, your progress matters.

Each year in June, we hold a graduation ceremony to honor your achievements.

No matter if you study online, in person, or at one of our satellite locations, all ESOL and HSE students with 65 or more hours of attendance are invited to join graduation. And, at graduation, you will be recognized and receive a certificate for your hard work!

Student Reward Program

This program celebrates your hard work and goals in school, family, community, and jobs.

You can get Reward Points for:

- Good attendance each month
- Reaching goals listed on your Reward Center Goal Tracker form
- Reading books from the library cart

How it works:

- Each month you get a paper with your point totals.
- Use points for prizes at the Reward Center (Room 3 - back). (Tip: You can save your points for bigger prizes.)
- The Reward Center opens once each month (dates posted in the school newsletter).

Important:

You cannot give points to other students. Only students attending classes in-person (at the "Green School," 408 Merrimack Street) are eligible for this program.



Citizenship Classes in

Are you ready to become a U.S. citizen? Abisi offers free 10-week citizenship classes (taught by Abisi's own, Gail Forman) to help you prepare for the naturalization process and interview.

In this citizenship class, you will:

- learn the 128 civics questions (covering US history, government, and culture)
- practice the reading and writing sections of the naturalization test
- review interview questions from the N-400 application

Student requirements:

- Intermediate level of English
- Green card holder for at least 4 years (or 2 years if married to a U.S. citizen)
- Good class attendance

Currently, this fall, classes will be offered:

Online (Zoom): Wednesdays, 6:00–7:45 pm, starting October 8.

In-person classes were cancelled this fall due to low enrollment. If you are interested in classes, it is important to sign up early!

Next year, there will be more citizenship classes scheduled, so be on the lookout!


Field Trips & Holiday Events


Hi, my name is Martha, and I'm the Level 5 ESOL teacher at the Green School.

If you want to become a United States citizen, I can help you prepare for it, and answer questions about the test. (For more information about citizenship classes, please see page 7.)


In my spare time, I like to volunteer in the community. I also enjoy learning new things. Right now, I am learning how to speak Spanish!

CREATE AN ACCOUNT: Test-takers must create an account at GED.com, and/or HiSET.org to schedule tests and receive/see test results.

FREE TEST VOUCHERS: Massachusetts will pay for up to 3 test attempts per subject. Enter the voucher codes when you schedule your test(s). For more details, refer to our website (or yellow box, right).

2025 TEST DATES: We offer paper-based tests once a month and computer-based tests (CBT) on select Thursdays.

2025 Paper Test Dates: Sept 19-20, Oct 17-18 Nov 14-15, Dec 12-13

2025 COMPUTER TEST DATES: HiSET: Sept 25, Oct 23, Nov 20, Dec 18 GED: Sept 18, Oct 16, Nov 13, Dec 11




