***Mrs. Roylos and Ms. Kelly/Mrs. Desharnais***

**Mrs. Roylos, Rm. 107-**

Red, Yellow, Blue and Orange teams were learning all about snails, fish, and the ocean environment in Mrs. Roylos' room. They observed live creatures, read stories about them, acted out stories with puppets, and drew the creatures they saw with a variety of art materials. Ask your student what he/she knows about snails and fish- they will have a lot of facts to share!



**Ms. Kelly/Mrs. Desharnais, Rm. 108-**

Red, Yellow, Blue, and Orange teams spent the summer program designing structures, building with lots of different materials, and creating with blocks and tiles. They also practiced playing simple board games, learning how to follow the rules of a game, and being good sports whether they won or lost. You might ask your student what their favorite board/card game is and play it with them!



***Mrs. Doherty and Mrs. Worthy***

**Mrs. Doherty, Rm. 109-**

Blue, Orange, Purple, and Green teams worked with a variety of natural materials with Mrs. Doherty. They studied plants, seeds, and even made wildflower seed balls! The students also spent time in our Lincoln School Garden collecting ripe tomatoes, cucumbers, basil and other plants. They also studied shells, snails, and other beach creatures. Lastly, they looked at beach rocks and decorated them with paint/markers. Have you seen the beautiful creations they have made?

**Mrs. Worthy, Rm. 110-**

Blue Orange, Purple and Green teams enjoyed studying different animals of the ocean during Mrs. Worthy's unit. Green sea turtles, octopus, and sharks are all examples of animals that were studied. Students wrote facts in their science journal, created clay ocean creatures, and finally created a final ocean box with as a culminating project. Ask your child what he/she learned about those ocean animals- they will be able to share some interesting animal adaptations.

Purple, Green, Pink and Brown teams have each worked on a play over our 3 ½ week program. They chose a play to work on together, chose parts, learned lines and songs, decorated set pieces, and planned out costumes in order to learn all that happens to put on a play or show. Purple, Green, Pink and Brown teams were treated to a really “cool” unit about scary stories and the biology of being scared. Ms. Smith read scary stories and discussed the elements of what made a story “scary”. Then they looked at the parts of the body that control their fears- the brain, heart, and nervous system. Students also made a few snacks, learning how to follow a simple recipe. Ask your child about the recipes they made or tell a spooky story with them. It will be a great summer treat!


**Mrs. Mendes, Computers-**
