No students should ever be dropped off at the first gate, as there are moving cars in that area. All drop offs should be made at the second gate only.

Please do not allow your child/children to run ahead of you, especially when using the first gate, as there may be cars moving at dismissal time. Teachers will not send students to the gate, unless an adult escorts them. Parents must walk in.

I am working to get sidewalks installed, but until that time, we need to use caution to keep all of our students safe!!

Soft Lockdown


- Lunchroom Lockdown

# MCAS Results Are In!

#### Our results are pretty positive!

Our third and fourth graders made us proud once again!

62% of our third graders scored in the meeting or exceeding category in ELA and Math.

49% of our fourth graders scored in meeting or exceeding category in ELA and 58% scored in meeting or exceeding category in Math.

This was a new version of the MCAS and the expectations were higher! Washington students scored significantly higher than the district and state average in most areas!

These results reflect the hard work done at every grade level and the attention to detail by all involved!



100% Attendance



Homework is a School Committee mandate. Suggested Amount of Homework Time Nightly is as follows:

Grade 1	20-30 minutes
Grade 2	25-45 minutes
Grades 3 & 4	40-60 minutes

We have tried to simplify it at all grade levels to make it predictable and easy to accomplish. Students in grades 1-4 will have math and word work assignments M-TH. In addition, K-4 students are expected to read at least 4 times a week for:

Grades K & 110-15 minutesGrade 215-20 minutesGrades 3 & 420-30 minutes
