SCHOOL INFORMATION

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION





The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to those who have passed the HiSET® exam, the GED® exam, or a combination of all subject tests from both exams. The Commonwealth has made available voucher codes for a candidate's first exam, plus two retakes, in each subject.

HISET:

- •Create an account at hiset.org. If you previously created an account with ETS, use the same email address and last name to ensure that your test scores are transferred.
- •Use Voucher Code MAHISET during checkout for all tests.

GED:

- Create an account at ged.com
- •Use one of the following Voucher Codes at checkout:
 - •MAFREEGED (first time taking a subject test at a Test Center)
 - •MARETAKE (retake of a subject test at a Test Center)

AAEC is an approved Test Center. We offer testing appointments for the HiSET on paper, HiSET on computer, and GED (computer only).

REWARD PROGRAM











The Reward Center will be open on Tuesday, March 21^{st} from 9:00 am - 12:30 pm.

The Reward Center is located outside Room 3 on the first floor. Classes will visit the center at specific times. Please wait to visit the center with your classmates.

If you plan to redeem your points, please bring your updated statement with you.

You can redeem your earned points now or continue to accumulate them for a bigger reward later.

CONVERSATION CLASS WITH DONNA

In response to the interest expressed by students in different ESOL classes to have more time to practice their conversation skills, we have been able to provide a class dedicated to conversation for students in our ESOL program. In the fall, students from Meg, Susan, and Liz's classes attended

a class lead by UMass students, and now students from Carrie and Daisy's classes are attending a class with Donna.

This is a voluntary class; however, regular attendance is encouraged as the hours are tracked and added to overall participation.

The students willingly comply with the "Only English" format. Students often work in pairs. Each participant is paired with a peer whose native language is different whenever possible.

MASSHIRE CAREER CENTER AT ABISI ADULT EDUCATION CENTER

On February 15th, Daphne Nichols from the MassHire Career Center of Lowell visited several of our in person and remote ESOL classes. Daphne Nichols and Caitlyn Gullage, Career Advisors, presented information about the Career Center and what they can offer our students. Using the Abisi computer lab, some students registered to become members. The only requirement for eligibility is a social security number. Membership is free and a great first step to a new job or career.

The Career Center offers a team of experienced staff that can assist our students in all aspects of finding a job and training programs. These services includ: Job searching assistance, Job recruitment for different companies, and Training programs.

Daphne will be back to visit our ESOL classes on March 1st and March 15th.

LENDING LIBRARY CARTS—UPDATE



Our library program continues to be very popular! ESOL and HSE students have a library cart available on each floor.

Students are enjoying the library Cart in HSE. The cart changes frequently as new books come in and as new themes are highlighted each month. Last month, students saw books displayed for February's theme which was Black History Month. March's theme is Women's History Month. Any HSE student can borrow a book by letting Christina or Maura know, and if they fill out a reflection form to share their personal connections to the book, they will receive reward points.

The ESOL classes look forward to Wednesday every week because that is **Library Cart Day!** Some people take a book home to read with their children. Others read the book on their own. It's wonderful to be able to

read a nice, new book. Please take care of the library books and treat them carefully. If you should leave the program, please return any library books you have borrowed so others can use them. In the past six months, our students have borrowed books 1,231 times! Last year, that number was only 768. Congratulations and keep reading!

Many of the titles were selected so that our students could share them with their children. After reading "If You Give a Pig a Pancake" and learning about how maple syrup is made, Carrie and Daisy's classes had a Pancake Breakfast.

CITIZENSHIP CORNER

A Helpful Tool to Use: USCIS Early Filing Calculator

As a lawful permanent resident, or Green Card holder, you may apply for naturalization when you meet **all** the requirements to become a U.S. citizen. Form N-400, Application for Naturalization, is the form used to apply for U.S. citizenship. United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) allows early filing of the N-400 form.

You may file the N-400 application **90 calendar days** before you complete your continuous residence requirement if your eligibility for naturalization is based upon being a:

Permanent resident for at least 5 years; or

Permanent resident for at least 3 years if you are married to a U.S. citizen

On its website, USCIS provides a free tool called the **USCIS Early Filing Calculator**. This tool helps you determine your 90-day early filing date. This date is important because if you apply earlier than 90 days before you are eligible, USCIS will return your N-400 application.

To use the Early Filing Calculator, you will need your Green Card and the date you became a lawful permanent resident. You can find this date on your Green Card at "Resident Since."

Here is an example of how to use the USCIS Early Filing Calculator:

Permanent Resident Since: 03/21/2019.

Add 5 years to the date; if married to a U.S. citizen, add 3 years. This gives you your Permanent Resident Anniversary Date.

Permanent Resident Anniversary Date: 03/21/2024. Enter this date into the calculator.



As long as this permanent resident has met all other eligibility requirements, the earliest date she can apply for naturalization would be on December 22, 2023.

The USCIS Early Filing Calculator, along with the instructions on how to use it, can be found at https://www.uscis.gov/forms/uscis-early-filing-calculator.
