HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to those who pass either the HiSET or the GED exams. These tests are comparable in terms of difficulty and rates of passing. A detailed comparison of these two tests, as well as information for testers under 18 years old, and those who want to apply for accommodations, can be found at https://www.doe.mass.edu/hse/comparison.html.

AAEC is both a Learning Center and an approved Test Center. We offer testing appointments for the HiSET on paper, HiSET on Computer, and GED (computer only). See dates below.

Free GED Testing for Massachusetts residents is now available! If you are scheduling a *subject test at a Test Center for the first time, use the voucher code MAFREEGED during checkout. If you are scheduling a retest at an official GED test center, use voucher code MARETAKE during checkout.*

The HiSET exam was recently acquired by a new company, PSI. HiSET testers must create new myHISET Accounts. If you started testing before this transition, you must create your myHISET account using the same email address and the same last name as you used previously. This way your new account will automatically be connected with your historical information, including test scores.

In the near future, the Commonwealth will also offer vouchers for HiSET Testing.


SCHOOL CLOSING/DELAYS

- Did you read the book with a family member?



AAEC REWARD PROGRAM

The Student Reward Program allows students to earn points for outstanding monthly attendance and/or completing one of their goals. Each goal has a pre-assigned point value. Students should notify their teacher when achieve a goal.

Once a month, students will receive a statement with their total earned Reward Points. These points can be redeemed for rewards (prizes/gifts) at the Abisi Adult Education Reward Center.

The Reward Center is open once a month. Dates are posted on the monthly newsletter calendar. Each class will have a specific time to visit the center.

Students can accumulate their points to get the biggest rewards or cash in their points at any time.

The Reward Center is located in the back of Susan's classroom on the first floor. Olga, our Student and Staff Support person, is responsible for the Reward Program.

Reward Points are non-transferable. You cannot give your Reward Points to another student.

CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA) TRAINING



Abisi Adult Education Program

The 2014 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requires states to provide Integrated Education and Training (IET) and Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) services. Adult education instruction is provided simultaneously with workforce preparation activities and workforce training (i.e., occupational skills training).

The CNA training is part of the MassSTEP ESOL, which includes ESOL instruction, workforce preparation activities, civics education, and workforce training. The purpose of these service is to facilitate credential attainment, workforce readiness, and entry into the workforce.

Congratulations to AAEC students enrolled in the training!

You completed the requirements to be enrolled in the program and you are ready to start!

During the next 18 weeks, students enrolled in the training will work hard to get the CNA, HHA certification, and the CNA MA state license.

CTI—COMMUNITY TEAMWORK



Community Teamwork Inc. (CTI) is a local community action organization providing support for families in need, promoting economic self-sufficiency for all, and building a stronger community by partnering with others to expand economic growth.

They offer workshops and classes to learn how to become a first-time homebuyer; weatherize your home to reduce waste and costs; open a small business; prepare the youth in your family for the future; access affordable quality early education and care; create a budget and gain financial independence; and more.

Fuel Assistance (LIHEAP)

LIHEAP, also known as Fuel Assistance, helps eligible households challenged by the high cost of home heating fuel pay a portion of their winter heating bills. Homeowners and renters, including households whose cost of heat is included in the rent, can apply for LIHEAP. Eligibility is based on their household size and the gross annual income of every household member, 18 years of age and older.

- Homeowners and renters are eligible
- Most who get fuel assistance also qualify for other energy assistance programs.

You may use any type of heating fuel (oil, electricity, natural gas, propane, etc.)

CITY OF LIGHTS PARADE


