HOLIDAY TREE RAFFLE

In December, AAEC held a holiday tree raffle. Students bought tickets for a chance to win a tree decorated with \$100 donated by the staff. All proceeds are donated to two local charities voted on by students and staff. Together we raised \$500.

The two charities selected to receive our donations were It's All About the Kids and the Merrimack Valley Food Bank. Each will receive \$250. Thank you for all your donations.

It's All About the Kids Foundation is a non-profit organization that helps Greater Lowell families and children with food, clothing, and gifts during the holiday season, and provide emergency assistance year-round. They work with social workers and guidance counselors in the Lowell Public Schools and other local agencies, serving over 300 families.

The Merrimack Valley Food Bank is one of four food banks in Massachusetts that serves local food pantries, shelters, and meal programs. They provide food and personal care items to emergency feeding programs serving the low-income, homeless, and hungry.

DNA MURDER MYSTERY LAB



Purple Group

The Purple group is learning about the importance of DNA fingerprinting. A "DNA fingerprint" is similar to a regular fingerprint but found within your cells. You are born with it. It is unique to you (unless you have an identical twin) and you can leave it behind wherever you go. It can be found on a skin cell, hair root cell, or even a cheek cell because your unique DNA is the same in all of your cells.

Students participated in a hands-on, simulated DNA Murder Mystery Lab. They became "Forensic Scientists" for the day and were asked to solve a murder by building DNA sequencing models from the crime scene and comparing the DNA fingerprint of the suspects to the victim's. They performed special DNA fingerprinting activities comparing fragments of bases that could be separated and analyzed to solve the mystery. The students were able to successfully crack the case and got a chance to see how important DNA is in the "real world."

Some student names and pictures have been removed from the newsletter, as some students have taken the option given at registration to request that their names and/or pictures not be used in any publications.

STUDENT INFORMATION AND ACTIVITIES

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as exactly equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET [®] or GED [©] test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer $HiSET^{\odot}$ testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer Based Testing and GED^{\odot} Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at www.lowelladulteducation.com.

HISET 2019 PRICE INCREASE

ETS has announced, effective January 1, 2019, the price for the HISET exam will increase. They will also be implementing new fees and amending their retest policy.

Cost:

- \$125 for the Paper Test Battery (\$29/first subtest, \$24/remaining 4 subtests in initial battery)
- \$103.75 for the Computer Test Battery (\$24.75/first subtest, \$19.75/remaining 4 subtests in initial battery)
- Testers will have the option to select which delivery mode they want for each subject test. Prices will adjust accordingly.

Updated Policies:

- Test takers must pay a \$9 test center fee if they miss or cancel their testing appointment. Included retests must be completed within one year of original purchase. Retest credits can only be applied to the same subtest and delivery mode. A price adjustment will be necessary if the delivery mode changes.
- Test takers have three attempts per calendar year (January—December), to take any subtest.
- A test taker will forfeit one attempt per subtest, if they miss a scheduled appointment.

New Fees:

- \$10 Registration by phone (to create an account, register for a test)
- \$10 Reschedule a test by phone (first time no charge).
- \$25 Request a Test Score be reviewed.

ESOL DISTANCE LEARNING



Distance Learning is learning outside of the traditional classroom through webinars and/or online courses. Students use email to communicate with the instructors and the internet to complete assignments.

A small group of ESOL students from Meg, Susan, and Liz's classes registered with Jocelyn to participate in the Winter USA Learns Distance Learning course. This online course helps students practice their speaking, listening, vocabulary, pronunciation, reading, spelling, writing, and grammar. It offers a combination of online instruction and face-to-face classroom support. The 11:00am classes will meet on Thursdays from 9:30am-10:30am. The 9:00am classes will meet on Tuesdays from 10:30am-11:30am in the computer lab.

This course began January 29, but there is still time to join. Registration is done through email only. Send an email by February 15, stating your name, teacher, and whether you attend the 9:00am or 11:00am class. Also include a sentence telling her why you want to participate. Jocelyn's email is *jmitchell@lowell.k12.ma.us*. Students are required to have access to email, the internet, and must be able to commit 5 or more hours a week outside of class.

PARKING

Students driving to school are encouraged to park at the Ayotte Garage, 1 Post Office Sq, across from Lowell High School. Bring your ticket with you to class. You can validate it in the office after classes are finished.

On-street, metered parking is also available. Meters have a 2-hour parking limit Monday through Saturday, from 8:00am-6:00pm. It costs \$3.00/2 hours. The kiosk accepts cash and credit/debit cards. If a pay kiosk is not working, go to another one, and enter your space number. You may get ticketed if you don't pay the meter.

- Do not park in the Santander Bank parking lot.
- Do not park in the Olympia Restaurant parking lot.
- Do not park in the Lowell Housing Authority parking lot.

CELL PHONE REMINDERS



Cell phones are not allowed to be used during class time. Turn it off or on silent and put it away.

When a cell phone goes off in class, it distracts everyone and takes away from everyone's learning. You are only here a short time, so make it count!

VISITOR POLICY

Summer – June 5th through August


Fall – September 4th through November

- Will you be able to attend all classes during the 10-week citizenship course?

MERRIMACK VALLEY HOUSING PARTNERSHIP (MVHP)

Looking to buy your first home? Project Genesis is a series of training seminars for first-time home buyers. It consists of 10 hours of instruction over four evenings. There is a fee to register for this course.

Kindergarten and Preschool Registration Information for School Year 2019-2020

Pre-School

If you have a child who is a resident of Lowell and will be 4 years old by September 1, 2019 (born between September 2, 2014, and September 1, 2015), your child is eligible to start preschool in September 2019. Lowell Public Schools offers 1/2 day pre-school, two sessions; morning or afternoon, five days a week.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

If you have a child who is a resident of Lowell and will be 5 years old by September 1, 2019 (born between September 2, 2013 and September 1, 2014), your child is eligible to start Kindergarten in September 2019.

Note: If your child is currently enrolled in PK with LPS, you must come in and register for kindergarten.

Registration for Kindergarten and Preschool will take place from March 1 through April 30, 2019, Monday—Friday 8:00am-4:00pm, and until 6:00pm on Thursdays. No registrations will be taken 1 hour before closing. Please call ahead to ensure they can service you properly.

Please note: The registration period is viewed as one day of registration. You are **NOT** required to register on the first day in order to be considered eligible. Please consider coming any time during the two-month period to avoid long lines.
