HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as exactly equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET [®] or GED [©] test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer $HiSET^{\odot}$ testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer Based Testing and GED^{\odot} Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at www.lowelladulteducation.com.

Detailed information about the two testing options, state requirements, accommodation for testers with disabilities, eligibility requirements, and other important information can be found on the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) website at www.doe.mass.edu/hse/. <u>HISET 2019 PRICE INCREASE</u>

ETS has announced, effective January 1, 2019, the price for the HISET exam will increase. They will also be implementing new fees and amending their retest policy.

Cost:

- \$125 for the Paper Test Battery (\$29/first subtest, \$24/remaining 4 subtests in initial battery)
- \$103.75 for the Computer Test Battery (\$24.75/first subtest, \$19.75/remaining 4 subtests in initial battery)
- Testers will have the option to select which delivery mode they want for each subject test. Prices will adjust accordingly.

Updated Policies:

- Test takers must pay a \$9 test center fee if they miss or cancel their testing appointment. Included retests must be completed within one year of original purchase. Retest credits can only be applied to the same subtest and delivery mode. A price adjustment will be necessary if the delivery mode changes.
- Test takers have three attempts per calendar year (January—December), to take any subtest.
- A test taker will forfeit one attempt per subtest, if they miss a scheduled appointment.

New Fees:

- \$10 Registration by phone (to create an account, register for a test)
- \$10 Reschedule a test by phone (first time no charge).
- \$25 Request a Test Score be reviewed.

MASSACHUSETTS HEALTH INSURANCE OPEN ENROLLMENT



If you are enrolled in a ConnectorCare or Health Connector plan, like *MassHealth*, now is the time when you can choose to renew or change health insurance plans for 2019. The Open Enrollment period is from November 1, 2018, through January 23, 2019. If you have *MassHealth* and received a renewal letter, please take action by the designated date on the letter. PARKING

Students driving to school are encouraged to park at the Ayotte Garage, 1 Post Office Sq, across from Lowell High School. Bring your ticket with you to class. You can validate it in the office after classes are finished.

On-street, metered parking is also available. Meters have a 2-hour parking limit Monday through Saturday, from 8:00am-6:00pm. It costs \$3.00/2 hours. The kiosk accepts cash and credit/debit cards. If a pay kiosk is not working, go to another one, and enter your space number. You may get ticketed if you don't pay the meter.

Remember:



- Do not park in the school parking lot.
- Do not park in the library parking lot.
- Do not park in the Santander Bank parking lot.
- Do not park in the Olympia Restaurant parking lot.
- Do not park in the Lowell Housing Authority parking lot.

CELL PHONE REMINDERS



Cell phones are not allowed to be used during class time. Turn it off or on silent and put it away.

When a cell phone goes off in class, it distracts everyone and takes away from your learning. You are only here a short time, make it count!

VISITOR POLICY

For the safety of all our AAEC students, outside visitors are not allowed to contact students during class time or to interrupt classes. If you forget something at home or someone needs to leave something for you, make arrangements to meet them after class. Deliveries and drop-offs are not accepted in the office. Please make sure you have all of your materials and items before you leave for school.

If there is an emergency, please speak with the office staff, and they can assist you.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS/DELAYS

The weather is always unpredictable in New England. In case of inclement weather, the Lowell Public Schools may cancel school or have a delayed opening. For example, last October, stormy weather and high winds knocked out power to many Lowell schools and residents resulting in school closings or delays.



Remember, we are part of the Lowell Public Schools and follow their school closing and delay policies.

IF THERE IS NO SCHOOL IN THE LOWELL PUBLIC SCHOOLS—MORNING AND EVENING CLASSES ARE CANCELLED.

IF THERE IS A TWO-HOUR DELAY IN THE LOWELL PUBLIC SCHOOLS—ONLY THE 11:00AM CLASSES WILL BE HELD. EVENING CLASSES MEET AT THE REGULAR TIME.

PLASTIC SINGLE-USE BAG BAN

Plastic single-use bags are now banned in Lowell and Westford for retailers that are 3,000 square feet or larger (Market Basket, Target, Walmart, Hannaford, etc.).

You can bring your own recyclable/reusable bags to use or purchase them at the stores checkout for an additional cost.

10-week FREE Citizenship Preparation Courses

2019 Citizenship Class Schedule Classes are held Wednesdays, 6:00 – 8:00 pm

Spring – March 6th through May (must be registered and have interview by February 28th)

Summer – June 5th through August

Fall – September 4th through November

Please note: To be eligible to take the Citizenship Preparation Course, students should be able to answer "yes" to the following questions:

- Have you been a lawful permanent resident (Green Card holder) of the U.S. for at least 5 years (3 years if married to a U.S. citizen)?
- Are you able to read, write, and speak intermediate English?
- Will you be able to attend all classes during the 10-week citizenship course?

MERRIMACK VALLEY HOUSING PARTNERSHIP (MVHP)

Looking to buy your first home? Project Genesis is a series of training seminars for first-time home buyers. It consists of 10 hours of instruction over four evenings. There is a fee to register for this course.

It is taught by MVHP staff as well as several volunteer real estate professionals. Instructors include lenders, attorneys, home inspectors, real estate brokers, and others.

Topics covered include an overview of the home-buying process, mortgage application process, down payment assistance, home inspections, building good credit, and more. These classes are offered in English, Spanish, and Khmer.
