COMMUNITY INFORMATION

CIVICS AND CITIZENSHIP FIELD TRIP



On Wednesday, February 27, fifteen students in the Civics and Citizenship class went on a field trip to the USCIS Field Office in Lawrence, MA to learn about the process of applying for citizenship.

John McCarthy, Community Relations Officer for the USCIS Boston District, and Ana Campas, Immigration Service Officer at the USCIS Lawrence Office, presented valuable information about the citizenship process to our students. They toured the facility and became familiar with where to go for their scheduled appointments. They visited the biometric room where the fingerprinting and photos take place, the waiting area where applicants wait to be called, and an interviewing office where the interviews with an immigration service officer are conducted.

During the tour, Officers Campos and McCarthy explained every relevant aspect related to the different processes, and how and why people use the office's services. This experience was meant to ease the anxiety and stress that accompany any immigration process. Many students found the information useful, especially those that are currently in the process of applying for citizenship.

The USCIS Field Office is located at 2 Mill St, Lawrence, MA. This office is open from 7:00am-4:30pm, Monday through Friday. In order to visit this office or to speak with an immigration services officer, you must have: an appointment scheduled by USCIS, make an *InfoPass* appointment at *www.my.uscis.gov/en/appointment*, or use the kiosks available in the lobby at the USCIS Lawrence office.

USCIS REMINDER: AVOID IMMIGRATION SCAMS

Many people offer help with immigration services. Unfortunately, not all are authorized to do so. While many of these unauthorized practitioners mean well, many of them are out to cheat you. HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as exactly equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET [®] or GED[®] test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer $HiSET^{\odot}$ testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer Based Testing and GED^{\odot} Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at *www.lowelladulteducation.com.*

CTI's Lowell Women's Week workshops on Building Assets will be held at their Financial Education Center, 165 Merrimack St, Lowell:



Please note: To be eligible to take the Citizenship Preparation Course, students should be able to answer "yes" to the following questions:

- Have you been a lawful permanent resident (Green Card holder) of the U.S. for at least 5 years (3 years if married to a U.S. citizen)?
- Are you able to read, write, and speak intermediate English?
- Will you be able to attend all classes during the 10-week citizenship course?

Kindergarten and Preschool Registration Information for the 2019-2020 School Year

Pre-School

If you have a child who is a resident of Lowell and will be 4 years old by September 1, 2019 (born between September 2, 2014, and September 1, 2015), your child is eligible to start preschool in September 2019. Lowell Public Schools offers 1/2 day pre-school, two sessions; morning or afternoon, five days a week.

Kindergarten

If you have a child who is a resident of Lowell and will be 5 years old by September 1, 2019 (born between September 2, 2013 and September 1, 2014), your child is eligible to start Kindergarten in September 2019. *Note: If your child is currently enrolled in PK with LPS, you must come in and register for kindergarten.*

Registration for Kindergarten and Preschool will take place from March 1 through April 30, 2019, Monday— Friday 8:00am-4:00pm, and until 6:00pm on Thursdays. No registrations will be taken 1 hour before closing. Please call ahead to ensure they can service you properly.

Please note: The registration period is viewed as one day of registration. You are **NOT** required to register on the first day in order to be considered eligible. Please consider coming any time during the two-month period to avoid long lines. MERRIMACK VALLEY HOUSING PARTNERSHIP (MVHP)

Looking to buy your first home? Project Genesis is a series of training seminars for first-time home buyers. It consists of 10 hours of instruction over four evenings. There is a fee to register for this course.

It is taught by MVHP staff as well as several volunteer real estate professionals. Instructors include lenders, attorneys, home inspectors, real estate brokers, and others.

Topics covered include an overview of the home-buying process, mortgage application process, down payment assistance, home inspections, building good credit, and more. These classes are offered in English, Spanish, and Khmer.
