This year, the Abisi Adult Education Center was awarded a grant from the GLHA to help us bring Mental Health Awareness workshops to our ESOL students. Throughout the school year, we will offer workshops to help immigrant students at AAEC understand what mental health is, its relationship to physical health, and its impact on life and learning. We hope to foster a supportive environment, decrease mental health stigma, and increase knowledge on accessing behavioral health services.

## HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET<sup>®</sup> or GED<sup>®</sup> test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer HiSET<sup>®</sup> testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer Based Testing and GED<sup>®</sup> Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at [www.lowelladulthoodeducation.com](http://www.lowelladulthoodeducation.com).

### PARKING

On-street, metered parking is also available. Meters have a 2-hour parking limit Monday through Saturday, from 8:00am-6:00pm. It costs \$3.00/2 hours. The kiosk accepts cash and credit/debit cards. If a pay kiosk is not working, go to another one, and enter your space number. Do not forget to pay the meter. You may get ticketed.

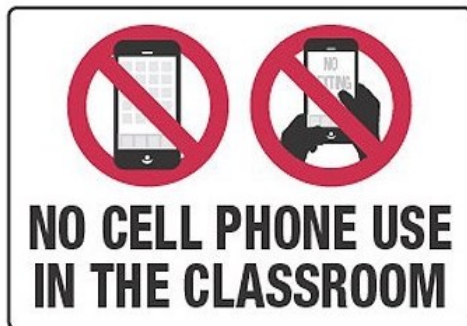
- Do not park in the school parking lot.

### LINKS @ MCC PRESENTATION

Karen Spengler, LINKS Program Coordinator and Advisor at Middlesex Community College (MCC), came and spoke with our HSE students about their LINKS program. She provided students with information about the LINKS program, the extra academic support available, and ways to transition into the different certificates and degree programs MCC offers.

LINKS is a free program for adults who are interested in enrolling in college and have a high school diploma or high school equivalency credential (HSET or GED) but would benefit from extra support while transitioning into the college setting. This program offers smaller class sizes, individualized guidance, and a unique opportunity for students to acclimate to the academic setting while earning free college credits.

#### STAND UP! BE COUNTED!

The Abisi Adult Education Center is a designated partner of the U.S. Census and will be working with the U.S. Census Bureau to make sure our students are counted.



Everyone must participate in the Census. In March 2020, a Census letter and questionnaire will be mailed out. It is easy to complete and only takes a few minutes.

Taking part in the Census is:

- **Important.** It will decide how much money the government will give our programs, community organizations, businesses, schools, Representatives in Congress, and more.

- **Safe.** Your personal information is safe, secure and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics—**they cannot be used against you in any way.** By law, all responses to U.S. Census Bureau household and business surveys are kept completely confidential.
- **Easy.** The U.S. Census Bureau will send a letter inviting you to go online and complete your census form if you can. Don't worry if you don't have internet access – you can respond by phone or paper, too. It takes approximately 10 minutes to complete the questionnaire. The online questionnaire will be available in 12 non-English languages (Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, Korean, Russian, Arabic, Tagalog, Polish, French, Haitian Creole, Portuguese and Japanese). Help will also be available by phone in some of these languages.
