HSE TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to those who have passed the HiSET® exam, the GED® exam, or a combination of all subject tests from both exams.

The Commonwealth has made available voucher codes for a candidate's first exam, plus two retakes, in each subject.

MASSHIRE LOWELL YOUNG ADULT SUMMER WORK EXPERIENCE

Student Spotlight - Juan Restrepo



Juan Restrepo has taken charge of his future.

As Juan completes his second year of ESOL evening classes, he recently earned the Certified IPC Specialist credential opening doors to a career as an Electronics Technician.

His story is inspiring.

After immigrating to the United States from Colombia in 2014, Juan was met with the challenge of learning a new language and a new culture. He worked nights to support his wife and two daughters while attending citizenship classes. After five years, Juan achieved citizenship in 2019.

Juan has been determined to succeed, and sought out both education and financial resources, including learning English at Abisi Adult Education Center. He also got career guidance and training funding through the MassHire Lowell Career Center. While working a full-time job during the day and attending English classes at night, Juan is also learning manufacturing skills at Production Line Support during the weekend. Upon completion of training, he hopes to attain a job at a local manufacturing company.

"Juan is incredible," said his teacher at Abisi, Mary Gail Jaggers. "He has the best attendance in my class. He always texts or emails information to share with class regarding job fairs or positions that are available. He stressed the importance of continued education and training in order to get a better job."

Juan's story speaks to the courage, determination, and strong work ethic he has exhibited—often overcoming significant odds—to reach his goals. He expressed to his class that he is "most grateful for what this country has given him, the opportunity to have a better life for him and his family."

As the school year comes to an end, we would like to thank everyone—students and staff—for supporting the Abisi Adult Education Center's Citizenship Preparation Program.

New in-person and remote Citizenship Classes will resume in the fall. Until then, there are many free resources available to help you prepare for the naturalization interview and test such as:

Pollard Memorial Library (In person):



A good place to start is at the Pollard Memorial Library, located at 401 Merrimack St. in Lowell. The library has a Citizenship Resource Corner which can be found in the Reference Room on the 2nd floor of the library. U.S. citizenship test preparation materials, including books, civics, reading, and writing flash-cards, and DVDs are available for check out with your library card.

<u>United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) online Citizenship Resource</u> Center (Online):

You can find free study materials and resources to prepare for the naturalization interview and test. This includes the 100 Civics Questions and Answers and a Civics Practice Test. A new four-part video series on the naturalization interview and test is also available. For more information, please go to https://www.uscis.gov/citizenship/find-study-materials-and-resources.



USA Learns (Online):

USA Learns is a website that offers free English classes. It also offers a citizenship course that can help you prepare for all parts of the naturalization interview.
