CINCO DE MAYO



HSE Testing Information

IMPORTANT: In order to be eligible to participate in the June Graduation Ceremony, HSE students must successfully complete all High School Equivalency testing on, or before, the weekend of May 19ⁿ/20ⁿ.

Registration and Scheduling Information:

Questions? See Denise, in the office, or speak with an HSE Staff member.

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to those who have passed the HiSET® exam, the GED® exam, or a combination of all subject tests from both exams. The Commonwealth has made available voucher codes for a candidate's first exam, plus two retakes, in each subject.

<u>HiSET:</u> Create an account at *www.hiset.org*. If you previously created an account with ETS, use the same email address and last name to ensure that your test scores are transferred. Use the following Voucher Code at checkout:

GED: Create an account at www.ged.com. Use one of the following Voucher Codes at checkout:

MAFREEGED (first time taking a test in a subject area at a Test Center)

MARETAKE (retake of a test in a subject area at a Test Center)

LOWELL PUBLIC SCHOOLS SUMMER PROGRAMS

Parents who want to take advantage of their summer vacation to participate in programs specially designed for their children cm can enroll in the Lowell Public School Summer Program. Opportunities are available for students from kindergarten students through grade 8. Students must attend the program at the school where they are currently enrolled. Students entering 5th grade in the fall will stay at the school where they went to 4th grade. Students who were in 8th grade this school year should remain at their current middle school.

Summer Learning Programs available:

- Half-Days (Morning)
- Transportation will be provided (if eligible) for most programs
- Free breakfast and lunch daily
- Option to sign up for Lowell Recreation Busy Bee program (ages 5-12) for the afternoon hours
- Offered at all schools to currently registered LPS students in grades K-12
- Free

Busy Bee's Lowell Recreation Info:

Parents can sign up at the same time as they register for LPS Summer Programs. Students will either be walked or transported to the following locations:

- Shedd Park Pyne Arts, Moody, Butler, Shaughnessy, Reilly, Sullivan (pick-up time is 3 pm)
- Morey Elementary Morey, Lincoln, STEM/Rogers, Bartlett, Stoklosa (pick-up time is 2:30 pm)
- Daley Middle School Daley, Bailey, Washington, Murkland (pick-up time is 2:30 pm)
- Gage Park Robinson, McAuliffe, Greenhalge (pick-up time is 2:30 pm)
- Wang Middle School Wang, Pawtucketville Memorial, McAvinnue (pick-up time is 2:30)
- There is NO late afternoon transportation provided by Lowell Rec programs! Parents must arrange to pick up their children from the site.

After LPS summer school ends, all students can attend the Lowell Rec programs from 9:00 am to 2:30 pm (3:00 pm for Shedd Park) through August 11th.

CITIZENSHIP CORNER

What does USCIS stand for? United States Citizenship and Immigration Services

Do You Know About the USCIS Fee Waiver and the Reduced Fee Request?

When lawful permanent resident, or Green Card holders are ready to file for citizenship, they must file Form N-400, the Application for Naturalization, with the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. The fee is \$640. The biometrics fee is \$85. That is a total payment of \$725.

If an applicant cannot afford to pay the naturalization fee, he or she may apply for a fee waiver or a reduced fee with USCIS.

- · If USCIS approves your fee waiver request, then you would pay \$0.
- · If USCIS approves your reduced fee request, then you would pay a total of \$405 (the reduced \$320 N-400 filing fee plus the \$85 biometrics fee).


Applicants must show proof that they are eligible for either a fee waiver or a reduced fee. Please see the USCIS links below for additional information on the eligibility requirements for each type of waiver request.
