STUDENT INFORMATION AND ACTIVITIES

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers two types of classes: English for Speakers of Other Languages and High School Equivalency. We offer morning and evening classes for residents living in the Greater Lowell area (Billerica, Chelmsford, Dracut, Dunstable, Lowell, Tewksbury, Tyngsboro, or Westford).

To register for classes:

- You must register in person. There is no online or phone registration available.
- You must bring a photo ID and proof of address with **your** name on it.
- Do not bring your children with you.
- Placement tests are given at the time of registration.
- You must be able to attend **all** of your scheduled classes every day.
- Classes may be full when you register. If full, you will be placed on a waiting list until space becomes available.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)



ESOL classes are for adult learners whose native language is not English. Students are placed in introductory, beginning, or intermediate classes to improve their reading, writing, and speaking skills. All instruction is in English. Students must be at least 18 years old.

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HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE)

High School Equivalency (HSE) classes help students improve their reading, writing, and math skills to take the high school equivalency exams, increase their career readiness skills, and/or prepare for college entrance exams.



Students ages 16-18 must bring a formal withdrawal form from the last school they attended.

STUDENT SERVICES COORDINATOR AND HSE TESTING SPECIALIST

Adriana is our Student Services Coordinator. She works closely with our Director, teachers, and student representatives to implement different programs related to students' goals and coordinating special school activities. Denise is our HSE Testing Specialist. She facilitates the HiSET® and GED® Computer-Based Testing and is available to help with test registration and answer your general testing questions. You can find her in the Main Office.

Gladys is our School Clerk. She is the first person to greet you in the Main Office and can provide you with information regarding classes and registration for our ESOL and HSE programs. Gladys also facilitates the HiSET-Paper Based testing.



Betty is the Director of the Abisi Adult Education Program. Her office is located on the Main Floor of our building. Her door is always open to students.



Carl is our custodian. He keeps our building clean and running smoothly. His office is located on the Lower Level.



Barbara maintains the student records and attendance for all our HSE classes. She also teaches a Math class in the morning program.

PARKING

Parking is often difficult in downtown Lowell and it can be costly. Students driving to school are encouraged to park at the Ayotte Garage, 1 Post Office Sq, Lowell, across from Lowell High School.

On-street, metered parking is also available. Meters have a 2-hour parking limit Monday through Saturday, from 8:00am-6:00pm. It costs \$3.00/2 hours. The kiosk accepts cash and credit/debit cards. If a pay kiosk is not working, go to another one, and enter your space number. Do not forget to pay the meter. You may get ticketed.

- *Do not park in the school parking lot.*
- *Do not park in the library parking lot.*
- *Do not park in the Santander Bank parking lot.*
- *Do not park in the Olympia Restaurant parking lot.*
- *Do not park in the Lowell Housing Apartment parking lot.*

Cars may be ticketed and towed.



CELL PHONE REMINDERS

Make sure your cell phones are turned off and put away before entering your class. Cell phones ringing and buzzing during class distract everyone.



VISITOR POLICY

All outside visitors must report to the main office and sign-in and out.

For the safety of all our AAEC students, outside visitors are not allowed to contact students during class time or to interrupt classes.

If you forgot something at home or someone needs to leave something for you, make arrangements to meet them after class. Deliveries and drop-offs are not accepted in the office. Please make sure you have all of your materials and items before you leave for school.

If there is an emergency, please speak with the office staff, and they can assist you.

If there is **NO SCHOOL** in the Lowell Public Schools—All Morning and Evening classes are cancelled.

If there is a **one-hour delay**, there will be no 9:00am ESOL classes. HSE classes will begin at 11:00am. Evening classes will meet at the regularly scheduled time.

If there is a **two-hour delay**, there will be no 9:00am ESOL classes. HSE classes will begin at 11:00am. Evening classes will meet at the regularly scheduled time.

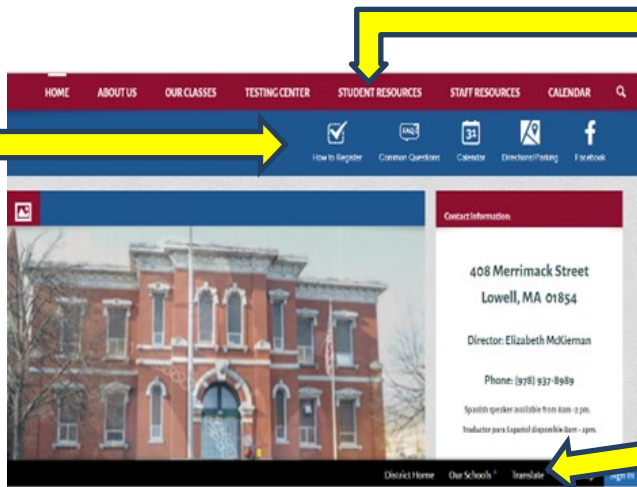

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET[®] or GED[®] test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer *HiSET*[®] testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer Based Testing and *GED*[®] Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at www.lowelladulthoodeducation.com.

CIVICS AND CITIZENSHIP CLASS

In order to sign up for this class, you need:

- to be a lawful permanent resident (Green Card holder) of the U. S. for at least 4 years (2 years if married to a U.S. citizen).
- to be able to come to school one hour before your class or stay after your class.
- to be interested in preparing for citizenship.

The Civics and Citizenship class will be accepting new students in January. If you are interested in becoming a part of this class, please see your teacher. Students enrolled in this class must have excellent attendance in their ESOL class.

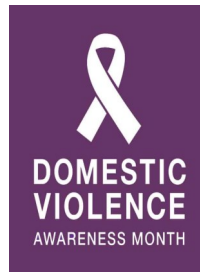

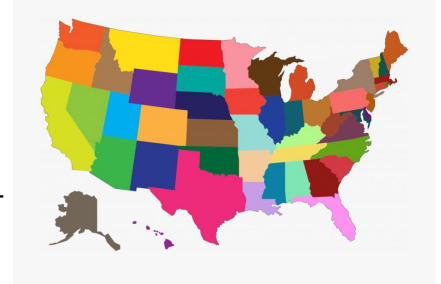

U.S. CENSUS 2020

CENSUS DAY - APRIL 1, 2020

Have you ever wondered how many people live in the United States?

The U.S. government is required to count the number of people living in the U.S. every ten years. This is called a Census. In April, each household will receive a census form to complete. All census responses are completely confidential and your personal information cannot be shared with any law enforcement agencies.



The census data provides the government with important information to help it distribute billions of dollars for public services like roads, schools, hospitals and healthcare clinics, fire and emergency response services, and hundreds of other programs. It also determines the number of seats each state receives in the U.S. House of Representatives.

It is very important that you participate in the Census in April 2020.
