CITIZENSHIP CLASSES

Meg, Susan, and Liz's ESOL Classes



A new session of our Citizenship Class began on January 7th.

Students will learn the information necessary to prepare for the citizenship exam and about the application process.

In order to be eligible to take this class, students should be able to answer "YES" to these questions:

- Have you been a lawful permanent resident (Green card holder) of the U.S. for at least 4 years (2 years if married to a U.S. citizen)?
- Are you interested in preparing for the citizenship application process, interview, and exam?
- Are you able to come to school **two days a** week before or after your class?

You can sign-up with your teacher. Enrolled students must have excellent attendance in their regular classes to participate.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET [®] or GED[®] test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer *HiSET*[©] testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer-Based Testing and *GED*[©] Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at *www.lowelladulteducation.com.*

COMMUNITY INFORMATION AND ACTIVITIES

COLD AND FLU PREVENTION TIPS

Seasonal flu is caused by a virus that infects your lungs, nose, and throat and makes you sick. Flu season starts in early winter, and continues through early spring every year. The flu comes on very quickly and makes you feel very sick. Most people will feel better within a week.

Flu is spread *easily* from person to person. When people with the flu cough or sneeze, the flu virus is in the wet spray that comes out of their nose and mouth. If you are near them, you can breathe in the virus and get sick.

The virus can also live for a short time on things you touch like doorknobs, phones, and toys. After you touch these objects, you can catch the virus when you touch your mouth, nose, or eyes. Adults with flu can spread it for about one day before symptoms appear to about one week after. Children can spread the flu even long after they get sick.

Tips to help prevent the spread of the Flu Virus:

- Get the flu vaccine every year as soon as it is available.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based hand gel.
- Cough or sneeze into a tissue or into the inside of your elbow if you don't have a tissue. Throw tissues away and wash your hands.
- Always wash your hands before touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Use household cleaners to clean things that are touched often, like door knobs, toys, and phones.
- Avoid close physical contact with people who are sick. Try to stay at least 3-6 feet from someone who is sick with the flu.
