The Frederick Abisi Adult Education Center will be holding its annual graduation ceremony on Friday, June 7, 2019, at the Lowell High School Auditorium.

This year, over 140 diplomas will be awarded to students who earned their high school credential and 700 certificates to ESOL students who completed a level of English instruction. Mayor William Samaras, State Representative David Nangle, Superintendent of Schools Jeannine Durkin, members from the Lowell School Committee, and other dignitaries will be in attendance.

Light refreshments will be served immediately following the graduation ceremony in the Lowell High School Cafeteria.

#### **Important Reminders and Information:**

- Arrive at the LHS Auditorium by 6:00 pm. Late comers will not be allowed to sit with graduates and walk across the stage.
- Dress appropriately; no hats, jeans or tee-shirts allowed.
- You will be sitting with your classmates and other graduates, not your quests.
- Children will not be allowed to sit with you. They must be seated with a responsible adult you invited.
- You must stay for the entire ceremony.
- Photo opportunities will be available after the graduation ceremony has finished. Audience members **CANNOT** come up on the stage or in the graduate area to take photos. You are not allowed to take selfies on stage.
- Parking garage tickets will not be validated graduation night. You will need

- ALL RETURNING AND NEW STUDENTS MUST REGISTER FOR CLASSES.
- You must register in person. There is no phone or on-line registration available. No one else can register for you.
- You must have a PHOTO ID and PROOF OF ADDRESS with you at the time of registration and when making an appointment (a driver's license, bill, or other mail delivered by the post office with <u>your name</u> on it).

- Do not bring your children with you. You will not be able to register if you do.

## HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as exactly equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass either the HiSET <sup>®</sup> or GED <sup>©</sup> test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing.

The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer  $HiSET^{\odot}$  testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing and Computer Based Testing and  $GED^{\odot}$  Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at www.lowelladulteducation.com.

#### NARCAN TRAINING

On Wednesday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, Lowell Community Health Center presented a training on how to administer the overdose-reversal drug nasal naloxone, also known as Narcan, to students in Susan and Meg's ESOL classes and several HSE students.

This training showed students how to recognize an opioid overdose and what to do if one occurs. It also covered the importance of calling 9-1-1, how to perform rescue breathing, and how to administer the nasal naloxone.
