STUDENT INFORMATION & ACTIVITIES

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as exactly equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass one of two assessment tests, either the HiSET ® or GED test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing but vary in significant ways as well.

Whichever test you choose, you must take it at an official test center in Massachusetts. The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer $HiSET^{\odot}$ testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing (PBT) and Computer Based Testing (CBT) and GED^{\odot} Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at www.lowelladulteducation.com.

Detailed information about the two testing options, state requirements, accommodation for testers with disabilities, eligibility requirements, and other important information can be found on the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) website at www.doe.mass.edu/hse/. PARKING

Students are encouraged to park at the George A. Ayotte Garage, 1 Post Office Sq, next to the Tsongas Center. Bring your ticket with you to class. After classes are finished, you can validate your ticket in AAEC's Main Office.

On-street, metered parking is also available. Meters have a 2-hour parking limit Monday through Saturday, from 8:00am-6:00pm. It costs \$3.00/2 hours. The kiosk accepts cash and credit/debit cards. If a pay kiosk is not working, go to another one, and enter your space number. Do not forget to pay the meter. You may get ticketed, if you don't.

- Do not park in the library parking lot.
- Do not park in the Santander Bank parking lot.
- Do not park in the Olympia Restaurant parking lot.
- Do not park in the Lowell Housing Authority parking lot.

CELL PHONE REMINDERS

Cell phones are not allowed to be used during class time unless your teacher says it's alright. You can return texts, tweets, social media posts, or emails after class.



Remember to turn your cell phone off or put it on silent mode before entering your classes and put it away before class starts. When a cell phone goes off in class, it distracts everyone and takes away from everyone's learning.

If you need to take a call due to an emergency, like work or child's school, quietly leave the classroom and take the call in hallway. Then, quickly return to your class.

VISITOR POLICY

For the safety of all our AAEC students, outside visitors are not allowed to visit students during class time or to interrupt classes.

Please make sure you have all of your materials and items before you leave for school. If you forgot something at home or someone needs to leave something for you, make arrangements to meet them after class. Deliveries and drop-offs are not accepted in the office. Your class time is short and important for your continued success.

If there is an emergency, please speak with the office staff, and they can assist you.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS/DELAYS

The weather is unpredictable in New England. In case of inclement weather, the Lowell Public Schools may cancel school or have a delayed opening. Last November, stormy weather and high winds knocked out power to many Lowell schools and residents resulting in school closings and delays.



Remember, we are part of the Lowell Public Schools and follow their school closing and delay policies.

Outreach Workers


Wednesday, November 7, 14, & 28 from 9:00am-12:00pm

CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT PROGRAM

Become a CNA and launch your career in healthcare! Free Certified Nursing Assistant Program at the International Institute of NE.

On Friday, October 26, Mary Zekic, a Skills Training Program Specialist from the International Institute of New England, held an information session for students in Meg and Susan's classes who were interested in seeking a career in the healthcare field.

In partnership with D'Youville Life and Wellness Community, Middlesex Community College, and Abisi Adult Education, the International Institute of New England will be offering a free CNA course designed for English Language Learners. The program will run from November 13, 2018, through March 14, 2019. Classes will be held at D'Youville Life and Wellness Community, 981 Varnum Avenue, Lowell and divided into 3 modules:

November 13—December 20 Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 3:00pm-7:30pm January 2—February 14, 2019 Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 3:00pm-9:00pm **February 19—March 14, 2019** Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 3:00pm-7:30pm

Here are some details about the program.

- It is a 16-week course designed especially for English Language Learners (ELL/ESOL) seeking a career
 in the healthcare field.
- The course includes English for Employment in Healthcare, skills development, and job readiness preparation.
- Students will also participate in clinical training: a 100-hour Certified Nursing Aide (CNA) module conducted by instructors from Middlesex Community College.
- Finally, students will prepare for the CNA licensing exam. Those who are successful will be offered a position at D'Youville Life & Wellness Community.

Important Notes:

- Students must have U.S. Work Authorization in order to apply and must <u>pass</u> a basic English language screening to enroll in the class.
- This course is free for qualified students.


