Lowell High School Kerouac Poetry & Short Prose Contest October 6, 2017

Jack Kerouac was born in Lowell in 1922 and graduated from Lowell High School in 1939. He started writing at age 11, creating neighborhood newspapers and sports reports. He continued to write throughout his life, leaving a legacy of over 30 written works, including poetry, journals and novels. Kerouac never wavered from his belief that "**the greatest satisfaction in life is writing**". Today, he is considered to be among the most influential writers of the 20th century, guiding the world to a new way of thinking-- that life and experience are the most beautiful and poetic "art" from which to draw inspiration.

Contest Details:

- Participants must submit 2 pieces of original work (poems or short prose – 450 words MAXIMUM)
- Each submission must be typed and labeled with your name, grade level, advisory room and your English teacher's name.
- Entries must be submitted to your English teacher by Friday, **SEPTEMBER 29th.**
- Be prepared to present your work before a panel of judges and an audience of LHS students on 10/06.
- There will be two rounds of readings. The first round will decide the **Top Ten Poets**. The second round will decide the **Top Three Poets**, after which the prizes will be awarded.

SECOND PLACE: \$150.00

THIRD PLACE: \$100.00
