You can apply for child care financial assistance!

To be eligible to receive funding you and your family must meet income-based and service need requirements.

You meet the requirement for a service need if you are:

- beginning a job or have a job
- · looking for a job
- participating in school or training program (not including graduate school)
- or your child has a documented disability or special need
- ** Service need must total 30 hours/week or a combination of work AND school or disability

- 2. To maintain spot on the waitlist:
 - Update your address and phone number regularly
 - Respond ANY TIME you receive a letter or phone call, even if you are not interested
 - Call and check your status every 6 months (978-686-4288)
 - Call to update any changes (new children, a move, change of phone number, etc.)
- 3. If contacted:
 - Respond immediately, even if you're not interested in the program that you heard from
