
The Career Academy and Engagement Center Model



In addition to the district's allocated budget, the Career Academy has benefited from the Lowell Full Service Community School (FSCS) initiative, funded by a \$2.5 million US Department of Ed. grant from 2015-2020. Based at the Career Academy and Engagement Center and serving five additional schools, it supports at-risk youth through wraparound partner services.





A recent study by UMass Lowell's Center for Program Evaluation shows that students' involvement in the Career Academy's community school programming has a positive effect on their credit attainment.



Sustainability



The Lowell FSCS initiative is actively seeking funding opportunities that target collective impact and student-centered learning models to continue to support the holistic needs of the community. Since 2018, the Career Academy has been awarded additional grant funding totaling more than \$160,000 for innovation, college and career readiness, wellness, and dropout prevention programing through state funding opportunities. Additionally, many partners have committed to continuing activities at a reduced scope in the absence of the federal FSCS grant. However, key components including the Program Manager position will require a long-term sustainability plan.
