DID YOU KNOW?

As shared by Amy Ellentuck on Friday, February 16, a 2014 alumnus named Kenneth Hong came to visit a few classes at LHS. He has an inspiring story to tell having grown up in Lowell with ALL the challenges



and hardships that many of our students face. His mediocre grades meant he didn't get in to many of the colleges he applied to but he was accepted in to the 5-year Myra Kraft Transition Program at Brandeis University and is currently in his 4th year. Only 20 students a year across the country are awarded this full scholarship. As we might imagine, this is not the easiest road to go down but he has received a lot of support while there.

Kenneth also spoke of the International Studies Gilbert Scholarship he was awarded last summer to study in Beijing for 9 weeks. He encouraged our students to seek out scholarships to study abroad. Between the Gilbert and some other scholarships including from the Greater Lowell Community Foundation, he has gone abroad a few times, including a service trip to Cambodia. These experiences have continued to broaden his future possibilities.

Finally, when asked about what high school factors helped him to keep moving forward when he'd think about giving

up, he talked about the program Upward Bound, joining the crew team, and his participation in Teen Block at the Lowell Community Health Center. He spoke of how important it was to feel connected to a couple of adults in the building and to some friends in order to stay tethered. These things are so significant! 
