The Senior Externship Program provides an eligible senior with the opportunity to investigate a career at a site related to their career interest. There were 39 seniors that participated in the program this year. Externship opportunities are available in the Health and Bioscience, Engineering and Civics, Citizenship and Communities pathway. Each student displayed a visual presentation of their experience and talked about what they learned during their 10 week externship experience. Business partners and site supervisors were invited to attend and tour the exhibit while enjoying breakfast prepared by students in the Culinary pathway. The following companies participated as host sites this year, Enel, MITRE, Nobis, Watermark, Tsongas Industrial Center, Lowell National Parks, Rapid Microbiosystems, Willow Manor, Wingate, Northwood Rehabilitation, Lowell General Hospital, Lowell High School Athletics, Therafit, Lowell Humane Society, Community Teamwork Inc., Living Waters, Riverside Surgical Associates, Reicheld Ting Orthodonics, Lowell Dentistry for Children, Trinity Ambulance, Pridestar EMT, Northeast Legal Aid.

Five of our students were selected for the MA Life Science Center School High School Apprenticeship Program at U Mass Lowell this summer; students will be work full time for six weeks in the biomedical/life science lab research area of the university.
