October is flying by and it's hard to imagine we are still enjoying this beautiful weather at least for another week or so! This fall has been pretty amazing, let's hope this weather is a good indication of a mild winter!

Our six person high school and central administration team returned late Friday from a very informative trip to Nashville, which included visiting two Nashville Public High Schools. We were invited by the one8 Foundation to be part of this visiting group along with Everett, Uxbridge, and Watertown High Schools. Nashville Public Schools began a district-wide high school redesign initiative based on the Small Learning Communities (SLC) model in 2008.

All twelve zoned high schools have been restructured into much smaller learning environments called The Academics of Nashville. All SLC students belong to a personalized smaller learning community around shared interests and based on personal relationships. We had the opportunity to visit Stratford STEM Magnet HS and McGavock HS.

The level of community involvement and commitment to these high schools (and students) is tremendous and critical to the success of the academy structure. All of the high schools have a Freshman Academy Model and

an A/B full year schedule (4 classes a day with an advisory time). The main focus is on relevancy which is accomplished by combining industry needs and resources with student interests. Students are exposed to many different academies in 9th grade (and some in 8th grade) so they can make an informed decision before committing to become part of one throughout the rest of their high school career. In the chosen academy structure, students take part in internships, use state of the art equipment (as donated by companies), work directly with industry partners in their classrooms, etc.

Of course my favorite part of the trip was meeting and talking with students, as you can in the picture to the right. The jackets and scarves the girls wear are part of the tour guide dress code. Students have to apply and go to training over the summer to be part of the group who welcome parents, freshman, tour groups, etc. to the school. They take their role pretty seriously and are important part of the culture of the school. We enjoyed meeting them along with other students who made us feel right at home!
