I do believe engaging students more in what they want to learn and how they learn it (to the degree it's appropriate) is something worth considering. I do see some students demanding more of teachers and their learning journey than perhaps they did years ago. Even though I don't agree with everything in this article, it gave me some ideas to ponder and I hope it does the same for you.
