# **BRIGHT SPOTS!**

Over the first weekend in January, 22 students in the Seminar in American Diversity class traveled to Montgomery, Alabama to dive more deeply into their study of civil rights in America. Together they spent two and a half days traversing the city:

- They stood in the spot where Rosa Parks got on the bus that sparked the Montgomery bus boycott;
- They walked in the old Greyhound bus station that college students traveled to and were attacked as they worked to integrate bus terminals;
- They visited the Southern Poverty Law Center to learn about hate crimes, both past and present;
- They stood in the church that Rev. Martin Luther King helped inspire a movement;
- They visited Rev. Dr. King's home and stood in his kitchen, where they heard a recording of one of his sermons, in which he spoke about sitting in that very kitchen and recommitting himself to the work of civil rights;
- They explored the newly opened National Memorial for Peace and Justice which honors the more than 4,400 African Americans who have been lynched in America;
- They spoke with civil rights lawyers working on mass incarceration and child incarceration; and,
- They visited the newly opened Legacy museum to better understand the direct connection between slavery and mass incarceration.



Throughout the trip our students immersed themselves in this work, writing, reflecting, asking powerful questions and having long discussions about our role in remembering history and carrying on the work of social justice. Now back in school they are working on publishing their book "We Are America." The
