Visit from Wilnelia Rivera



The Black Unity Club invited guest speaker Wilnelia Rivera (bio below) to recognize and celebrate Black History month on Tuesday, Feb 26. Wilnelia spoke about the importance of political and civic engagement. Wilnelia shared her journey and learnings from Lawrence High School to her current role as a Principal of Rivera, Consulting, Inc. She was motivational, inspiring and engaging and a pleasure to have on campus. Thank you to Yvette Cheeks for inviting her, and the Black Unity Club for sponsoring her to speak and share her fascinating story with us.

Wilnelia Rivera bio - From leading statewide policy campaigns for the reform of the criminal record system to integrated voter engagement and candidate campaigns, Wilnelia Rivera, Founder of Rivera Consulting, Inc., leads a movement building firm that inspires and enables social change while operationalizing solutions for the 21st century. Wilnelia is a political strategist, urban planner, and project management professional. Her journey began in Lawrence, Massachusetts, where her childhood was defined by the duality of injustice and persistent hope - planting her lifetime commitment to social change. This commitment took her first to the neighborhoods of Chicago and Detroit as a union organizer and then back home with Neighbor to Neighbor Massachusetts (N2N-MA).

At N2N-MA, she took a deep dive in the grassroots and progressive political movement of the Commonwealth, where she represented over 18,000 members. Together they elected dozens of candidates to political office, recruited 8,000 new members, and ushered a new era of criminal justice reform with the Commonwealth CORI Coalition. During this time, she also deepened her professional experience, through strategic partnerships and learning journeys that brought her to Los Angeles, Oakland, New Mexico, Miami, and New York City (Brooklyn and Bronx), Mondragon, and Venezuela. The course of Wilnelia's career shifted when she joined Governor Deval Patrick's senior staff as the Director of External Affairs, ushering a profound phase of public service in state government. She then established a cross-sector early college consortium at Madison Park Vocational High School and now is the Founder and Principal of Rivera, Consulting, Inc.

Managing your digital files can really help with time management. There is nothing worse than wasting time looking for something, or even worse, recreating something you cannot find. I like using a book analogy when explaining how to organize Google Drive. Think of your LPSD Google Drive as a book about your employment at LPSD, and create folders for the different chapters - reflecting the different aspects of your job. You can also nestle folders within folders to represent subchapters. A good way to start is to set a regular time aside (15 min/week) to work on organizing your files. Need help?
