Develop the topic with relevant facts, definitions, concrete details, quotations, or other information and examples.</p> <p>c. Use appropriate transitions to create cohesion and clarify the relationships among ideas and concepts.</p> <p>d. Use precise language and domain-specific vocabulary to inform about or explain the topic.</p> <p>e. Establish and maintain a style appropriate to audience and purpose.</p> <p>f. CONVENTIONS OF STANDARD ENGLISH										
<p><b>L7.1</b> Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English grammar and usage when writing or speaking; retain and further develop language skills learned in previous grades.</p> <p><i>Sentence Structure, Variety, and Meaning</i></p> <p><b>a.</b> Use phrases and clauses to communicate ideas precisely, with attention to skillful use of verb tenses to add clarity.</p> <p><b>b.</b> Recognize and correct vague pronouns (those that have unclear or ambiguous antecedents).<sup>1</sup></p> <p><b>c.</b> Recognize and correct inappropriate shifts in pronoun number and person in sentences with multiple clauses and phrases.</p> <p><b>d.</b> Recognize that changing the placement of a phrase or clause can add variety, emphasize particular relationships among ideas, or alter the meaning of a sentence or paragraph.<sup>17</sup></p>	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓
