



~Make your own percussion instrument! Use the link below for ideas, or try one of these:

SHAKER: put rice inside a plastic egg or soda bottle

GUIRO: use a pencil to scrape the side of a water bottle with ridges.

DRUM: tap gently with pencils or chopsticks on the bottom of a bowl, can, or cooking pot.

Decorate your instrument with paper, crayons, yarn or stickers. Play some rhythm patterns on your instruments. Find a pattern you like and repeat it 4 times. Save your instrument(s). Next week we'll use them again!
